Project Objective:

The Native Village of Mekoryuk (NVM) will carry out a clean-up of the community's subsistence camps. The clean-up project will improve environmental and community health, subsistence travel safety, and increase environmental awareness.

Results:

- Approximately one ton of trash removed from subsistence camping sites.
- 5 different subsistence sites were cleaned up.
- Educational outreach efforts reach 200 community members.

Benefits:

It will lead to greater community involvement in village solid waste programs, enabling villages to accomplish more, with lesser resources. Clean and healthy subsistence lands are a top priority for most rural communities throughout AK because of the heavy reliance on subsistence food and the central role subsistence activities play in community residents' daily lives

Lessons Learned:

- Under estimated number of old 55 gal drums.
- Good community outreach helped the project.
- Have plan for equipment break downs.
- Schedule project educational events that don't interfere with subsistence activities.
