



- You must arrive in a personal vehicle
- Items to bring:
 - Photo ID
 - Health insurance card (everyone who has both symptoms and exposure will be tested regardless if they have insurance)

THINGS TO CONSIDER

- There are no bathrooms;
- Each person who needs testing must be seated next to a **working window**;
- All passengers must stay inside vehicles from arrival to departure;
- Try to limit the people in your vehicle to those needing testing; and
- There may be **significant wait times**

ARRIVAL

- Each vehicle will be greeted and directed by personnel in full medical protective gear.

REGISTRATION

- Each person needing testing will be asked to provide the following:
 - Photo ID
 - First and last name
 - Health care provider name and contact information
 - Current address (where you are staying)
 - Best phone number to reach you (indicate mobile/landline)
 - Insurance card (if available)
- Each person will receive be screened to determine if they require testing.

TESTING

- A health care provider in personal protective equipment will provide you with instructions.
- You will be given a tissue to blow your nose and will need to keep your tissue to dispose on your own.
- A soft swab will be inserted deep into your nose to get the necessary sample. This may be slightly uncomfortable; however, the test is quick and should take less than a minute.

WHAT TO DO WHILE AWAITING TEST RESULTS

- **Please keep all handouts until you get your test results.**
- Follow the instructions on the paper provided by the Community-based Testing Site. Continue to monitor and record symptoms. If you test positive, you will receive test results via telephone within a week.
