

Who is ANHB?

- Vision: ANHB is the unified voice of the Alaska Tribal Health System and the advocacy leader for the health of Alaska Native people.
- **Mission:** To promote the spiritual, physical, mental, social, and cultural well-being and pride of Alaska Native people.
- Advocacy organization for the Alaska Tribal Health System
- 28 member organizations who serve the 229 Tribes in Alaska and 180,000 AN/AIs throughout the state.

Goal of Advocacy

The **goals** of advocacy are to facilitate change and the development of new areas of policy, in order to tackle unmet needs or deal with emerging needs in a given community.

Federal Budget

- President's Budget
 - Starts about two years in advance
 - Tribes provide input through the IHS Budget Formulation Process
 - OMB Aggregates Departmental Budget Recommendations
 - February or March President's Proposed Budget is released
- Congressional Appropriations
 - Appropriations Committees
 - 12 Subcommittees
 - Starts in House of Representatives
 - Negotiated with Senate


