We had an oilspill back in 2020 and it was really hard to find funding and people to clean it. But through the Coast Guard we are getting things started for clean up now.

No small emergency spill response kits available

Not sure if its in your plan, but shipping regulations on hazardous materials is hard to plan around in Alaska.

Maniilaq Envir. and it is really hard to get a response from the person who works there. As we need to give him heads up before shipping on an airline. so doesnt sit @ airlines
